DROUGHT CONDITIONS

The current lake levels are at 30.1%. Stage 2 of the drought contingency plan comes into effect when lake levels fall below 30%. Restrictions for Stage 2 are as follows:

- 1 Irrigation of landscaped areas shall be limited to once every other week (trash pickup day of the week). However, irrigation of landscaped areas IS permitted on any day if it is by means of a handheld hose, a faucet filled bucket or watering can of 5 gallons or less.
- 2 Where applicable, watering of golf course fairways is prohibited. The watering of greens and tees are limited to once every other week (trash pickup day of the week).



DROUGHT CONDITIONS CONT.

Stage 2 also has the potential for a temporary rate increase structured as follows: after 3,000 gallons of usage, water rate may be 1.5 times the published rate per 1,000 gallons. To find this information and more, please review our drought contingency plan found here:
